## Spotlighting Information in Public Service

### Did you Know?

#### Transportation Safety Institute (TSI)

**The Transportation Safety Institute (TSI)** has provided high-quality safety and security training to Federal, state, and local governmental, private sector, and foreign transportation professionals for more than 40 years. TSI was established in 1971 to assist U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) modal administrations accomplish their mission essential training requirements. Since its inception, TSI has expanded its clientele to keep up with the needs of the Department and transportation industry. As a Federal fee-for-service organization, TSI plays a critical role in supporting the USDOT’s mission to ensure safety and security in the nation’s transportation system

through instruction to both those entrusted with enforcement and those committed to compliance. TSI is part of the newly established Office of the Assistant Secretary for

Research and Technology (OST-R), whose mission is to advance multi-disciplinary research, cutting-edge technologies and, ultimately, the promise of innovation, to make the nation’s transportation system safer, more competitive and sustainable today, tomorrow, and for future generations.

**Facilities:** TSI’s headquarters is in Oklahoma City, OK, and is co-located with the Mike Monroney Aeronautical Center (MMAC), a large Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) facility. TSI occupies offices, classrooms, and

laboratory space with self-contained learning centers and a full complement of state-of-the-art teaching equipment and models. The Institute provides indoor and outdoor training sites equipped for hands-on workshops to complement classroom instruction, including an open-air “boneyard” and a “crash lab” containing a wide variety of specially selected crash and accident specimens.

**Divisions:** TSI is organized into five training divisions with expertise in specific transportation safety and security topics. TSI has a mix of 42 federal and contract personnel on-site, and more than 300 part-time contract and

associate faculty members nationwide. The most current cross-cutting subjects are taught by nationally recognized subject matter experts. In addition,

TSI provides the administrative services

necessary to support a full-service training organization.

**The Aviation Safety Division** is home of the “National Aircraft Accident Investigation School”. This team specializes in aircraft accident investigations and safety management systems with courses that cover aviation’s most current technologies in all aspects of general and commercial civil aviation, as well as public-use aviation by Federal, state, and local governments. Staff provides training in aviation

safety, accident investigation techniques, and safety management through workshops, field activities, individual studies, and hands-on training. Since 1971, TSI Aviation alumni have participated in more than 124,000\* aircraft accident and incident investigations, and in coordination with FAA Safety Initiatives, have contributed to a 71 percent reduction in the number of yearly aircraft accidents and incidents for the year 2014 compared to the year 1970\*.

**The Multi Modal Safety Division** provides a variety of transportation safety-related courses to Federal, state, and private industry audiences including hazardous materials transportation and motor carrier safety compliance. Training includes field activities to prepare participants for immediate transfer of information from a classroom to on-the-job situations while emphasizing the practical side of regulatory compliance.

**The Special Programs Division** is fully entrepreneurial, offering customized courses and services to meet changing customer demands. Services include course development, program management, event coordination, and other administrative services. This division continues to develop a line of business designed for the oil and gas industry, specifically Pipeline Safety Compliance (PSC) training.

**The Highway Traffic Safety Division** provides state-of-the-art classroom, virtual online, and self-paced e-learning training opportunities to the highway safety community. The team specializes in the professional development of highway safety and law enforcement personnel throughout the country. These trainings provide the skills to manage highway safety programs that reduce traffic crashes, fatalities, and

injuries.

**The Transit Safety and Security Division** provides training and educational opportunities to the public transit bus and rail industry. The staff develops and delivers innovative and responsive classroom, virtual live, computer based and field exercise based training to meet the needs of today's changing transit industry. Sponsored by the Federal Transit Administration, the Division will provide training for the national Public Transportation Safety Certification Training Program, and specializes in safety management systems (SMS), system safety, collision investigation, crime prevention, substance abuse management and program compliance and emergency management. Transit personnel throughout the United States attend trainings to attain the core competencies to operate, maintain, and manage public transportation systems. More than 10,000 transportation professionals are trained each fiscal year.

**Operations Support Services** provides responsive business, technical, financial and programmatic support services that enable the Director and the Division Managers of the Institute to successfully accomplish the TSI mission.

The Institute partners with a variety of clients from USDOT, State and local governments, Foreign Entities, and many non-governmental organizations.
